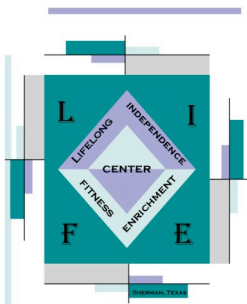


SKILLED NURSING UNIT

33 Large Private Rooms

- Referred patients typically range in age from 70 and over.
- Patients are usually recuperating from strokes and/or orthopedic surgeries.
- Patients may need a little more time to recuperate in SNF UNIT prior to starting 3 hours of daily inpatient rehab.
- Your doctor may suggest that you begin your recuperation in the skilled nursing unit.
- Patients are able to maximize their potential by building their strength in the skilled unit, and receiving at least one hour of daily rehab, prior to utilizing precious, time-limited rehabilitation inpatient days for more intensive therapy.
- The therapy team begins working with each patient during their stay in the skilled unit and the same team will transition with the patient to rehab.
- Family caregivers are encouraged to be a part of the recuperative team!

- **Experienced clinicians and medical directors carefully assess and coordinate each patient's physical readiness status, as this factor is the critical ingredient for each individual to achieve his/her desired goal-personal independence.**
- **Those ready for inpatient rehabilitation received three hours of very intensive therapy daily in order to be readied to return home within 10-11 days to resume independent living.**
- **A transition room is established in the rehab hall for patients to prepare to return home**
- **LIFE Center seeks to achieve an 85-90% discharge-to-home rate from the rehab unit back to home.**
- **A caregiver resource center is available to the community to help families identify resources and options for independent living.**
- **Life Center is a Medicare certified facility and accredited by the Joint Commission.**
